Copilot Credits

Overview

As AI workloads become more advanced, particularly with multi-step, agent-driven scenarios, the amount of work required to complete a task can vary significantly. This variability is best served by a usage-based model that aligns cost to the work performed, complementing subscription-based services with flexible consumption. Copilot Credits serve as the common currency in this usage-based model, powering AI capabilities across Microsoft offerings. These capabilities span Microsoft Copilot experiences such as Copilot Cowork, agents and apps built with Microsoft Copilot Studio, AI-powered capabilities in Dynamics 365 and Power Platform, and Work IQ APIs for agent and AI solutions.

The number of Copilot Credits consumed for each response, action, or operation depends on the complexity of the task performed. Copilot Credits are pooled at the tenant level. An organization's total cost is based on the sum of Copilot Credits consumed across all supported experiences. This shared model enables organizations to centrally manage consumption and allocate usage across scenarios. Copilot Credits are offered through the Microsoft Copilot Studio pay-as-you-go meter and the Copilot Credit Pre-Purchase Plan.

Copilot Credit Purchase Options

1. Microsoft Copilot Studio Pay-As-You-Go Copilot Credit

The Microsoft Copilot Studio pay-as-you-go Copilot Credit meter enables organizations to post-pay based on the actual number of Copilot Credits consumed by agents in a billing month. No up-front commitment is required, allowing organizations to scale usage and ensure business continuity for critical business processes with flexibility, scalability, seasonality, and no interruptions due to overages.

- Pricing: \$0.01/Copilot Credit
- Meter Definition: The Microsoft Copilot Studio pay-as-you-go Copilot Credit meter counts the total number of Copilot Credits consumed by agents. This usage is billed in arrears at the end of the billing month.

2. Copilot Credit Pre-Purchase Plan (P3)

Copilot Credit P3 is a one-year pay-upfront purchase option for Copilot Credits. Customers purchase a pool of Copilot Credits, which are automatically deducted from the Copilot Credit P3 balance. If usage exceeds the available number of credits, customers can purchase additional Copilot Credits or be billed on a pay-as-you-go basis. Unused credits expire at the end of the annual term.

Managing Usage and Spend

Copilot Credit usage is centrally managed through the Microsoft 365 admin center (MAC), giving administrators the capabilities to govern AI consumption across workloads, services, and agents. Administrators can monitor spend and usage, configure spend policies, define usage thresholds, and manage Copilot Credits allocation across the organization. Usage Based Billing Across Workloads

The sections below detail usage-based billing through Copilot Credits across **Copilot Cowork**, **Work IQ APIs**, **Microsoft Copilot Studio**, and **Business Applications**.

Copilot Cowork

Copilot Cowork is an agentic system that plans, executes, and delivers real work. Describe the outcome you want, and Cowork does the work, building apps ([Microsoft Frontier Program](#)), sending emails, scheduling meetings, creating documents, posting in Teams, and managing files, while you stay in control. Grounded in Work IQ and operating within Microsoft 365's security and governance boundaries, Cowork runs multi-step work autonomously at enterprise scale. [Learn more about Copilot Cowork](#).

How Copilot Cowork uses Copilot Credits

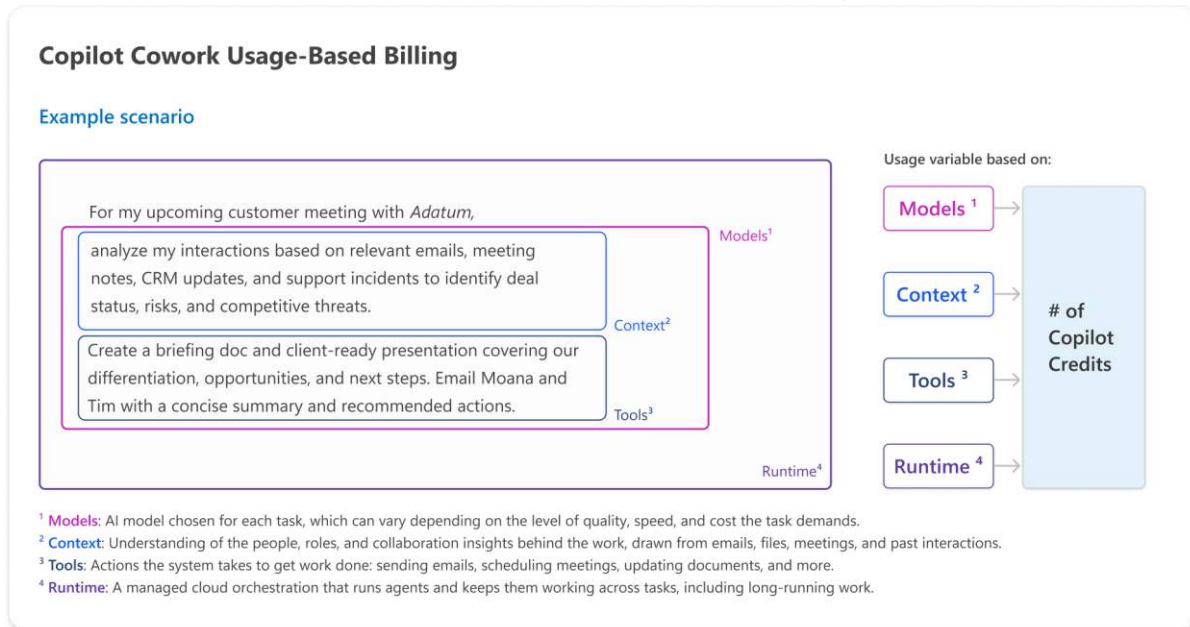
Users rely on Cowork for complex, multi-step work across apps that runs autonomously. Credit usage scales with task complexity, driven by intermittent steps and capabilities involved.

Copilot Credit usage for a given task varies based on the mix of four cost buckets:

- **Models** — AI models chosen for each task, which can vary depending on the level of quality, speed, and cost that the task demands.
- **Runtime** — A managed cloud orchestration that runs agents and keeps them working across tasks, including long-running work.
- **Context** —Understanding of the people, roles, and collaboration patterns behind the work, drawn from emails, files, meetings, and past interactions.

- **Tools** —Actions the system takes to get work done including sending emails, scheduling meetings, updating documents, and more.

Copilot Cowork tasks and task types

Copilot Credit consumption varies based on the type and complexity of the task being performed. This section provides estimated consumption for representative task types.

Light tasks

Leverages a handful of knowledge sources for a light reasoning scenario like a summary, usually resulting in one short deliverable.

- Few sources
- Light reasoning
- 1 or fewer outputs

"Create a weekly status update for my team that runs every Monday morning - including my top-of-mind priorities and a short list of key executive meetings pulled from my calendar."

Medium tasks

References many sources over varying timeframes, uses structured reasoning, and produces multiple deliverables.

Heavy tasks

Requires deep analysis and broad source aggregation over long time frames, generating many outputs.

- Broad aggregation
- Deep reasoning
- Many outputs

Prompt example

"Analyze 6 months of exported product usage data to understand usage patterns, classify prompts, and produce a leadership-ready report ... " (shortened)

Est. Credits >700

Apps in Copilot Cowork ([Microsoft Frontier Program](#))

a. Build apps

With Cowork, users can leverage a secure, governed way to build apps using natural language. Users describe the app they want to create, and Cowork generates the data schema and user interface required for the app.

Apps built in Copilot Cowork are billed through Copilot Credits usage-based billing. Copilot Credit consumption varies based on the LLM model used, the complexity of the app, and the amount of generation and iteration involved during creation.

b. Host, run and manage apps

Apps built in Cowork are deployed to a Microsoft-managed host. The Microsoft-managed host uses Microsoft Entra authentication and provides the infrastructure required to deploy, run, monitor and manage apps while applying enterprise governance, security and administrative controls.

Hosting, runtime and management of apps deployed to the Microsoft-managed host are billed through Copilot Credits usage-based billing. Copilot Credit consumption varies based on the volume and complexity of the tasks processed by the app.

By default, apps built in Copilot Cowork follow Copilot Credits usage-based billing. However, for users licensed with Power Apps Premium User Subscription Licenses (USLs), app usage is included, subject to [existing](#) Power Apps Premium request limits. Runtime usage exceeding those limits is billed through Copilot Credits usage-based billing. Usage of AI-powered runtime, such as [agents](#) and [Work IQ APIs](#), is not included in these limits and consumes Copilot Credits. 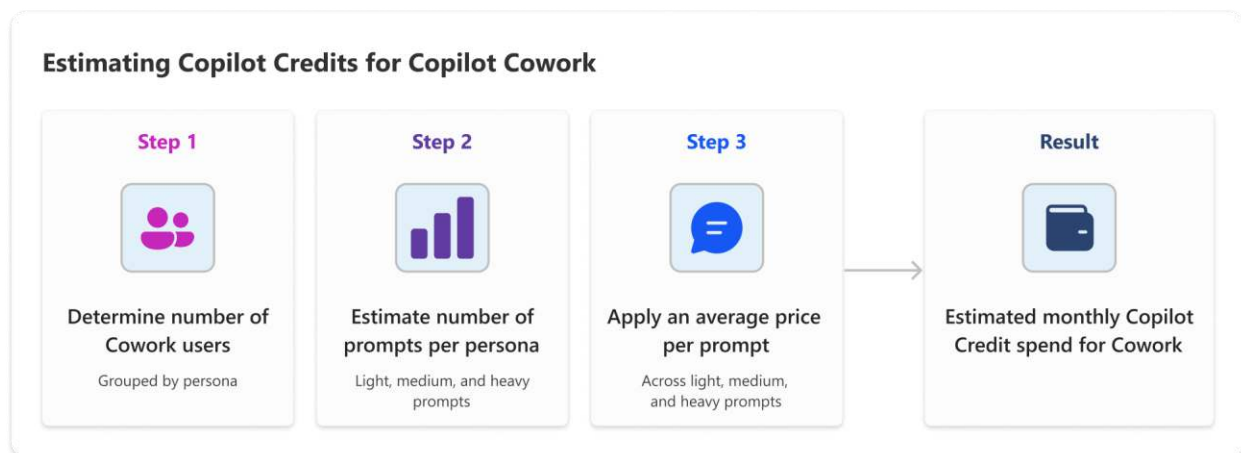
Managing Copilot Cowork usage and spend

To help organizations translate this model into practical planning, the simplest way to estimate Cowork usage is by first sizing the number of users, then modeling usage intensity across light, medium, heavy profiles and finally applying an estimated pricing per prompt. This approach provides a way to forecast usage based on expected behavior.

Estimating Copilot Credits for Cowork:

1. Determine number of Cowork users (grouped by persona)
2. Estimate number of prompts per persona (across light, medium, and heavy prompts)
3. Apply an average price per prompt (across light, medium, and heavy prompts)

Result: Estimated monthly Copilot Credit spend for Cowork



Organizations can use this same methodology to build their own estimates, adjusting user counts, intensity assumptions, and cost inputs to reflect their environment, using [this simple, transparent model](#).

Work IQ APIs

Work IQ is a workplace intelligence layer that enables agents and applications to access and reason over organizational data, context and tools. It continually builds a semantic understanding across Microsoft 365 and external systems with built-in permission-aware governance.

Microsoft Work IQ APIs enable developers to build agentic and AI-powered applications that securely reason over Microsoft 365 data. Work IQ APIs are available through A2A, MCXP and REST protocols and support permission-aware access to organization data and actions. are the access mechanisms that expose the Work IQ intelligence layer to developers allowing apps and agents to reason over Microsoft 365 data while preserving permissions, compliance and governance controls.

Work IQ is a workplace intelligence layer that delivers semantic understanding of everything happening across your business. Built on four core components: chat, context, tools, and workspaces, it continuously transforms signals from Microsoft 365 and business systems into agent-ready intelligence for grounding, reasoning, and permission awareness. The result is a platform, built for agentic intelligence, speed, and efficiency at enterprise scale enabling higher utilization, with security and governance by design now accessible via APIs. By shifting more AI processing into the Work IQ runtime, tokens needed for context retrieval and tool use are reduced by up to 80%, thereby reducing Copilot Credit consumption in agentic solutions.

How Work IQ API uses Copilot Credits

Usage is billed in two parts: a variable charge for query-style consumption (grounding, retrieval, and reasoning) and a static component for actions and tools.

Query Type	Scope	Copilot Credits Consumption
Work IQ Chat or Context API	Variable	Query-style consumption — grounding, retrieval, and reasoning. Driven by models, runtime, context, and tools.
Work IQ Tools API	Static	0.1 Copilot Credit per API call for actions and tools.

Work IQ API Experiences

Given cost scales with usage and intensity, pricing is easiest to reason through representative scenarios. The ranges below are illustrative and will vary with the complexity of the query:

Scenario	Work IQ API examples
Light	“Identify tasks or action items assigned to me from my manager and compile them into a checklist.”
Medium	“Review the latest customer interview emails to identify top themes and roadmap impact and recommend three prioritized product actions with alignment, tradeoffs, and objections.”
Heavy	“You are a business partner and PR-sensitive editor. Your job is to produce Level 1 and Level 2 summaries from our most recent roadmap executive review and use the latest meetings, documents, and what’s top of mind for our CMO.”

Managing Work IQ API usage and spend

Work IQ APIs can be invoked in agents and AI solutions on behalf of any Microsoft 365 user. These agents can be built on a variety of agent building platforms such as Microsoft Copilot Studio, Azure Foundry etc. Use of Work IQ APIs in these agents and AI solution scenarios is billed using Copilot Credits. Work IQ APIs are not included as entitlements in the Microsoft Copilot license.

Microsoft Copilot is natively built on Work IQ and does not need to leverage Work IQ APIs. There are no incremental charges for Work IQ accessed in Microsoft Copilot experiences such as chats, AI experiences in apps such as Word, Excel, PowerPoint, or agents natively included in Microsoft Copilot such as Researcher, Facilitator and Analyst. The usage charges described above only apply to access to Work IQ using the Work IQ APIs.

Note: There are no changes to the licensing for older APIs such as Retrieval API and Chat API. Users licensed with Microsoft Copilot were not charged for use of these APIs. This licensing model will continue for now.

Microsoft Copilot Studio

Microsoft Copilot Studio is a comprehensive conversational AI platform that empowers users to create, customize and deploy agents, apps, workflows and agent flows using natural language or a graphical interface. With Copilot Studio, users can easily design, test and publish agents tailored to specific needs for internal or external scenarios across industries, departments, or roles. How Copilot Studio uses Copilot Credits

Copilot Studio harnesses

Agents, workflows and agent flows built in Copilot Studio use a harness. A harness is the software scaffolding that enables an agent to plan, reason, maintain context, and interact with tools, systems, or other agents to complete tasks. Harnesses can be optimized for different results, depending on the desired outcome. In certain scenarios, the selected harness can also affect how Copilot Credits are consumed during creation and runtime execution.

Copilot Studio supports three harnesses, each designed for different building scenarios.

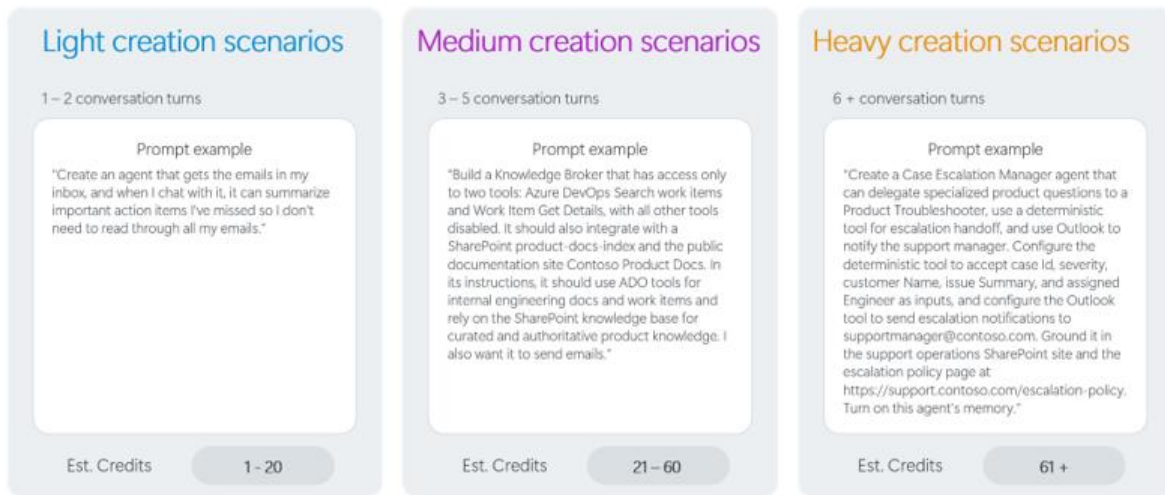
Harness	Description
GitHub Copilot Harness	Agents and workflows: Build agents that automate end-to-end business processes.
Standard Harness	Agents and agent flows: Build rule based conversational agents with predefined topics and flows.
Copilot Chat Harness	Agents: Create agents that extend Microsoft Copilot with your organization's knowledge.

Copilot Studio authoring experience and runtime usage of agents and workflows

Building agents and workflows with the GitHub Copilot harness consumes Copilot Credits during LLM-power creation experiences, including natural language authoring, evaluation, and preview. Manual, non-LLM configuration does not require Copilot Credits.

GitHub Copilot harness runtime

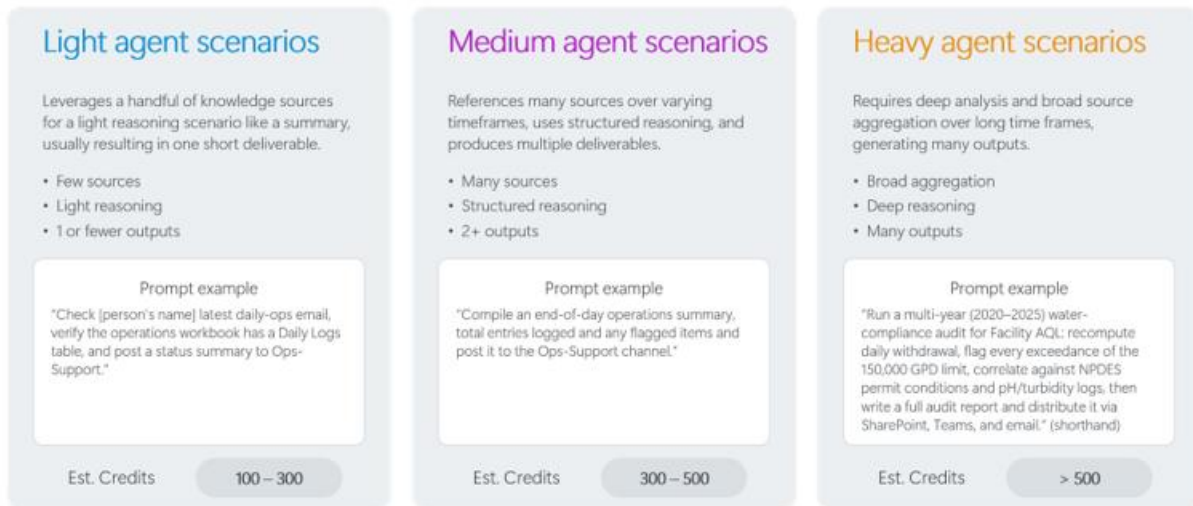
Agents and workflows built with the GitHub Copilot harness can perform complex, multi-step tasks autonomously. Copilot Credit consumption increases with the complexity of the work being performed.

Runtime costs are driven by four factors:

- **Models** — AI models chosen for each task, which can vary depending on the level of quality, speed, and cost that the task demands.
- **Runtime** — A managed cloud orchestration that runs agents and keeps them working across tasks, including long-running work.
- **Context** — Understanding of the people, roles, and collaboration patterns behind the work, drawn from emails, files, meetings, and past interactions.
- **Tools** — Actions the system takes to get work done including sending emails, scheduling meetings, updating documents, and more.

Because usage depends on these factors, the most effective way to estimate cost is through representative scenarios. The examples below are illustrative and actual credit consumption will vary based on task complexity.

Standard and Copilot Chat harnesses

Standard and Copilot Chat harnesses runtime

Runtime execution in Microsoft channels for agents and agent flows built using the Standard harness and agents built using the Copilot Chat harness are included with the Microsoft Copilot USL (fair usage limits apply). Otherwise, Copilot Credits are required.

Apps in Microsoft Copilot Studio ([Paid Public Preview](#))

a. Build apps

Makers can build apps in Copilot Studio and publish them into a Microsoft-managed host. Apps built in Copilot Studio are billed through Copilot Credits usage-based billing. Copilot Credit consumption varies based on the LLM model used, the complexity of the app, and the amount of generation and iteration involved during authoring.

b. Host, run and manage apps

Apps built in Copilot Studio are deployed to a Microsoft-managed host. The Microsoft-managed host uses Microsoft Entra authentication and provides the infrastructure required to deploy, run, monitor and manage apps while applying enterprise governance, security and administrative controls.

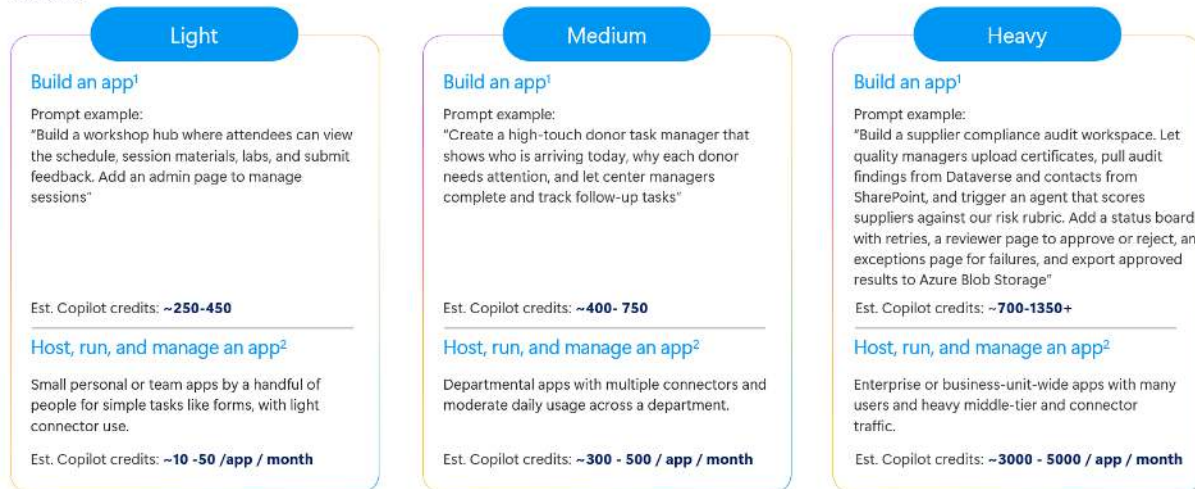
Hosting, runtime and management of apps deployed to the host are billed through Copilot Credits usage-based billing. Copilot Credit consumption varies based on the volume and complexity of the tasks processed by the app.

Running apps built in Copilot Studio by default follows Copilot Credits usage-based billing. For users with Power Apps Premium USLs, running apps built in Copilot Studio is included,

subject to [existing](#) Power Apps Premium request limits. Runtime usage exceeding request limits is billed through Copilot Credits usage-based billing. Usage of AI-powered runtime, such as [agents](#) and [Work IQ APIs](#), is not included in these request limits and consumes Copilot Credits. Managing Copilot Studio usage and spend

Organizations can estimate Copilot Studio consumption by evaluating the types of agents, apps and workflows they plan to deploy, the expected number of users, anticipated traffic levels and features used within each solution. Copilot Credit consumption varies based on design, orchestration, knowledge sources, tools, workflows and user interaction patterns. Forecasting expected usage helps organizations plan budgets, and align spend with anticipated outcomes.

Estimating Copilot Credits for GitHub Copilot harness

1. Identify the agents, apps and workflows expected to be deployed.
2. Estimate user volume and interaction frequency.
3. Evaluate solution complexity, including orchestration, knowledge sources, actions, workflows, and AI tools.
4. Use the Microsoft [Copilot Credit Estimator](#) and to model potential Copilot Credit consumption and spending based on traffic, orchestration, knowledge, and tool usage. *(This estimator provides a monthly Copilot credit informational estimate for a single agent and makes no guarantees of final costs.)*

Business Applications

Across Business Applications, Copilot Credits power AI and agentic capabilities in Dynamics 365 and the Power Platform, with credit consumption varying based on the capabilities already included in each license.

Dynamics 365 Agents

Copilot Credits are consumed in both prebuilt and custom Dynamics 365 agents. These credits pool at the tenant level, so they should be allocated to environments to manage usage across workloads. For pricing and licensing details, see the [Dynamics 365 Licensing Guide](#).

Power Apps Premium

Apps in Cowork and Copilot Studio

Using apps built in Copilot Cowork ([Frontier](#)) and Copilot Studio ([Paid Public Preview](#)) is included with Power Apps Premium User Subscription Licenses (USLs), subject to existing Power Apps Premium request limits. Runtime usage exceeding these request limits is billed through Copilot Credit usage-based billing. Usage of AI powered runtime, such as agents and Work IQ APIs, is not included in these request limits and consumes Copilot Credits. Refer to the Request limits and allocations, the Microsoft Copilot Studio Licensing Guide, and the Copilot Credits Guide for details.

AI in apps with Microsoft Copilot

For Power Platform workloads, Power Apps and Power Automate, Copilot Credits apply only when AI or agentic functionality is invoked, such as:

- Interacting with Copilot Studio agents embedded in apps or workflows.
- Using AI tools, prompts, or generative AI capabilities (summarization, data exploration, or document processing).
- Running AI Tools or Copilot-assisted features when usage exceeds included entitlements or is backed by Copilot Credits.
